Dear JPC Family,

Last January, about 25 of us spent some time looking deeply at who we are as Jonesborough Presbyterian Church. We thought carefully about and affirmed the things that characterize our congregation and our shared ministry.

We also began to look critically at the possibility that some of the things we have been doing for years might be things that our current and becoming congregation no longer feels passionate about. We were less intentional about naming specific ministries that we may have outgrown than we were about simply accepting the fact that to make changes and adjustments does not signal any kind of defeat. Faithful change is renewal. It acknowledges that our membership and context have changed. Being blessed with new folks, and faced with new challenges calls us to and equips us for our new work.

As a way to begin living into our future, Jeff Batkin, who led our visioning retreat, helped us to begin writing a new Mission/Vision statement. He challenged us to use that statement as a guide by which we assess everything we do as Jonesborough Presbyterian Church. Anything we do that does not connect substantively to our Mission/Vision statement becomes something about which we need to ask, *Is this thing truly important to who we are? Or is it something we do because we've always done it?*

If that thing does not actively create new life and energy for us, then we need to honor it and give thanks to God for it, but allow it to become something we did in the past as preparation for what God has called us to be and do next.

After working with many suggestions and additions, the session, at its February meeting, tentatively approved the following statement, around which we felt consensus and positive energy:

As followers of Christ,
 We seek to know, love and serve God
 Through music, story and laughter,
 In our community and the world.

Think about this statement as you take part in the work you do at JPC. Does this statement capture, succinctly and memorably, what is unique about us? Is it specific enough to shape our present and future actions?

The session will revisit this Mission/Vision statement again over the next couple of months and adopt it, or a version of it, very soon. Please let us hear from you.



DID YOU KNOW:

Memorial Day was formerly known as “Decoration Day”?

It originated after the Civil War to commemorate fallen Union soldiers. Southern women and children had been decorating the Confederate graves but each region in the South had its own date.

By the 20th century Memorial Day was extended to remember ALL men & women who died while in service in the US Armed Forces.

Memorial Day was first celebrated in Charleston, SC on May 1, 1865.

The date of Memorial Day was chosen because it was NOT the anniversary of any battle of the Civil War (War Between the States).
