

Dear Friends,

In a book I've been reading recently, I came across a very interesting story. Years ago an old mountain man had been asked if he'd ever been lost. He replied, "No. I've never been lost. But sometimes for a month or two, I didn't know how to get where I was going."

"If I had a nickel, "I thought.

Life itself, and especially the life of faith is a pilgrimage, a journev. It often takes us through forests, across deserts and overseas where we don't know exactly where we are and how to get where we are going.

And by "where we're going," I don't just mean the afterlife and whatever it may or may not be. When referring to "where we're going," I'm talking about arriving at each place of new understanding and beginning—the places in the process of being human that we become more fully human, more clearly a reflection of the Holiness in whose image we are created.

As JPC continues its work of discerning who we are and where we are going, we may spend some time in places of wandering, places where we feel as if we've lost track of how to get where we're going. We can take at least some comfort in the truth that when Jesus calls us to follow him, he does not promise ease and certainty along the way. He simply promises to be with us. The only way to be truly *lost* on this journey, then, is to withhold Christ's grace and love from others, and to refuse to welcome them into the challenging but transforming work of discipleship.

It occurs to me, too, that as a 200-plus year-old congregation, Jonesborough Presbyterian is hardly a newcomer to the process of working through challenges, of listening to God's voice, making the changes and adaptations to continue being and becoming a place of relevant worship, service and spiritual nurture. Had this church *not* been able and willing to make such changes in the past, there would be nothing left of us but a historical plaque out by Main Street.

We are more than a plaque. We are a lively, welcoming, growing, nurturing, servant church. We may be rethinking some aspects of our mission. We may need to tweak the way we express and approach our vision for the future, but we will continue to seek to be faithful to the ways and words of Jesus of Nazareth.

So, take heart. Even when we have no idea how to get to where we're going, we will not be lost.
